(T3) Hornbeam reduce height by 3 metres and reduce lateral limbs back to boundary line. (T4) Walnut reduce height by 3 metres and reduce lateral limbs back to boundary line. (T5) Cherry reduce hight by 3 metres and reduce lateral limbs back to boundary line **F&HDC Approved**

- a. Pilgrims Way, The Street and Staple Lane, Postling: 22.11.21-10.12.21, proving the route and desilting by Openreach. Works not yet started.
- b. Chairman contacted Highways on 5.11.21 regarding their inaccurate notice about road closures to "Pilgrims Way, between Sandling Road and The Street". Highways assured that the letter will be resent with the correct information and that the closure on Pilgrims Way will be between Stone Street and The Street/Staple Lane. The contractors have also confirmed that Access Only signs will be used during the closure.
- c. Cuckoo Lane: 14.10.21, BT Openreach work to trees (PC not informed)
- d. Broad Street, Lyminge: 23-31.10.21, phased closures of Broad Street, Lyminge, from 23.10.21 with estimated completion by 31 October 2021 to provide new water supplies.
- e. Broad Street, Lyminge: from 31.10.21, temporary 30mph Speed Limit in conjunction with temporary traffic lights. 31.10.21 until estimated completion by 26 November 2021.

Regarding insurance, our provider informed that as long as the phone box is included in our risk assessments and maintained to ensure it is safe, they are happy to include it in our Public Liability at no additional charge.

11. The Queen's Green Canopy / The Queen's Platinum Jubilee

Susan Carey kindly offered a tree which could be a replacement for the diseased holly tree felled from outside the village hall and would not incur a cost to the parish council. Bulbs could be planted around its base. Susan will request the tree officer contacts the Chairman to discuss suitable tree species. **It was resolved** to update and confirm at the next meeting.

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12. KFRS/KALC Fire Hydrant Initiative

KFRS continue to inspect fire hydrants throughout Kent and Medway mainly on a rolling four yearly programme which for some hydrants is actually less due to the perceived risk they might support. Therefore they are asking local parish councils to undertake inspections in addition to the ongoing work KFRS undertakes.

- The inspections can be undertaken by anyone within the local council or community
- The inspections are to be visual inspections only and no risks should be taken at any time
- All issues reported to KFRS will be rectified based on the severity of the defect.

KALC has provided a parish Fire Hydrants map and Cllrs will inspect and report back to KFRS. Postling PC will sign up to the KFRS/KALC Fire Hydrant Initiative in order to receive further information on hydrant inspections/repairs.

Appendix

Report from County Councillor Susan Carey

Thank you to those who responded to KCC's consultations on our budget for 2022/23 and the one on Household Waste Recycling Centres. These have both now closed and will help us make our decisions. There's still time to respond to the Heritage Strategy which is asking for views on how KCC gives advice on heritage matters as part of the planning process, how archaeological finds are recorded, stored and accessed, a policy on metal detecting on KCC's own land and more. This consultation is open till 13 December and can be seen at https://letstalk.kent.gov.uk/

KCC has just announced our EV600 plan. This will provide 600 Electric Vehicle charging points in council owned car parks across Kent within the next two years. Folkestone & Hythe is one of the councils providing space for 94 chargers in at least 25 of its 27 car parks.

The roadworks programme is being paused over Winter and the gritting programme has begun. In October 3,166 sqm of road patching and resurfacing took place in the Folkestone & Hythe area and 77,307 sqm over Kent as a whole. The resurfacing programme will resume in the Spring. However, potholes will continue to be filled so please report potholes and any blocked drains (gullies) to KCC either online or at 03000 41 81 81 and make a note of the reference number which helps if the work needs chasing.

You may be aware of Kent's Plan Bee (if not, do have a look at what's happening to promote pollinators in the county). We now also have Plan Tree and each County Councillor is being allocated trees to plant in their division. If you have any suggestions on where best to do this in the Elham Valley, do let me know. The project is to run for three planting seasons and can be either street trees or other public land.

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Kent residents are being asked to report but not to pick up dead or sick birds they find as there have been a number of confirmed cases of avian flu in both wild and captive birds across the country including Essex. They should be reported to the Defra Helpline on 03459 33 55 77.
