- 2. There were no declarations of interest on Agenda items.
- 3. **It was resolved** to accept the Minutes of the meeting held on 27 November 2019 which were signed by the Chairman.
- 4. There were no matters arising from Minutes of the previous meeting.
- 5. **To consider** Planning Applications received since the last meeting, circulated to Councillors for comments, the outcomes of those deliberations, and to consider any further applications received since this agenda was published:

- 8. Website (compliance with the Public Sector Bodies (websites and mobile applications) (no.2) Accessibility Regulations 2018): The parish clerk will register with HugoFox with the aim to have the new website complete in time for the next meeting on 25 March. A new domain name may be needed. Clerk's overtime fee of 2 days at £160 for building website was approved, with any further time to be approved. Costs were proposed by Cllr Helen Calderbank and seconded by Cllr John Pattrick.
  New website, to be managed by parish clerk, is expected to come in at c.£200 including year 1 domain name and hosting fee.
- 9. Community Resilience and Emergency Plan was discussed. The 'Household Emergency Plan' document will be circulated to parishioners on the parish email list and pinned to noticeboard. This can also be downloaded from <a href="https://www.kentprepared.org.uk/">https://www.kentprepared.org.uk/</a>
  - Parish Council to complete Kent Community Risk Register, ie. what to do in case of: severe weather, environmental issues (eg. flooding, land slip), emergency services, contact details for power outages, health and infectious diseases, structural damage
  - Risk Assessment to be reviewed to ensure emergency situations for chairman and clerk are included.
- 10. Following a meeting with representatives from Otterpool Park team in December, a map has been received which confirms the water main runs via the A20 and not through Postling village.
  - Ian McClintock has been working with F&HDC to provide advice direct to the parishes affected by Otterpool Park. Ian's contract has now come to an end, and F&HDC have stood down his services for now, but with the potential to enlist him again at a future point.
  - Councillors have found Ian to be a very useful resource. His knowledge, support and commitment to the parishes has been invaluable and Postling Parish Council thank him for his contribution.
- 11. KCC Parish Highways Improvement Plan: from KCC 'The Highways Improvement Plan scheme has been in place since May 2019 and provides an opportunity for Parish Councils to engage with their residents to identify highway priorities in their area and then work with KCC on what highway improvement(s) could be taken forward in their area and how this might be funded.'
  - Any requests to this scheme are to be funded by the parish. Inclusion of request for replacement Postling sign at junction of Cuckoo Lane and Sandling Rd was discussed.

### **Appendix**

### 5a. Comments to F&HDC on Y19/1258/FH Postling Lodge, Farthing Common:

Postling Parish Council Object to this application on the grounds that:

- 1. The gateway is out of keeping with the woodland setting within the AONB.
- 2. The entrance driveway is on a blind bend on a narrow road.
- 3. There appears to be the creation of another driveway adjacent to the one detailed in this application, but not included in this application.
- 4. During construction of the walls, gates and tarmac driveway, many trees were felled, and where the entrance was widened and the passing bay created, it has broken the natural wildlife corridor.
- 5. No comment can be made regarding the outbuildings as these cannot be viewed from the road.

### 7a. Report from District Councillor:

MHCLG Garden Communities capacity funding for this year (Otterpool Park) - we have recently been notified that we will be receiving £580K. It's the second highest allocation to any project.

Folkestone & Hythe District Council's overview and scrutiny committee is planning its programme for 2020/21 and seeking suggestions for matters which are important to your community. If there are items you would like considered please send to Committee Services at the Council.

Special meetings are being held for Folkestone & Hythe district residents to have their say about any community safety issues where they live. ### 7b. Report from County Councillor

KCC will be debating and setting its budget for 2020/2021 on 13 February. A rise of just under 4% (half 'ringfenced' for spending on social care and half towards increased costs for other services). This is the first year since 2010 when our Government grant will rise rather than reduce but we will still be making savings and using some of our reserves to balance the budget. As well as rising demand for social care KCC, in common with other local authorities, has seen a sharp rise in the number of children assessed as needing special education which is considerably more expensive than mainstream education. We are also proposing to allocate more spending on our roads.

You will be aware that Highways England are removing the barrier for Operation Brock on the M20 and restoring it to a normal motorway with a hard shoulder by the end of January. This will of course mean that if there is cross Channel disruption due to bad weather, industrial action or other emergency, we will once again have Operation Stack and KCC is pressing the Government to do more to make trade between the UK and continent 'frictionless' by use of new technology for 'smart borders'.

Finally, I'd like to draw your attention to the consultation under way on KCC's priorities for the next 5 years. As well as commitments on the Environment there's a shift of emphasis to our universal services such as Highways. This is your chance to say if you agree with the direction we want to take so please go to www.kent.gov/5yearplan and give your views. You have until 17 February.
